Dear Friends,

In 2011, Project Harmony was the beneficiary of continued support and interest of this generous community allowing us to offer expanded services to our young clients, more extensive case coordination and increased training opportunities for our child protection partners and the public. Many of you responded with overwhelming support to the Growing Harmony for Children Capital Campaign, which in 2012, will culminate in a grand opening of our expanded facility. This facility will allow for increased partnerships, services and resources for abused children, making Project Harmony one of the largest Child Advocacy Centers in the country. Even with this growth, the professionals at Project Harmony remain focused on the one child - each one of the more than 2200 during 2011 - who comes through our door to find help and healing. **One Child, One Place, One Time** remains at the core of our program.

Once again, more than half of these children were under the age of six and sexual abuse continues to be the most frequent type of abuse evaluated. In the past year, Project Harmony also provided investigative and medical services for children who witnessed violence (domestic violence, homicides) as well as those who endured physical abuse and/or neglect. With your help, these young victims continue to receive only the best from Project Harmony staff and the collective partners responding to all forms of child abuse. Each child and his/her family have a very unique story. However, the common element in each of these stories is another "one" - the **One With Courage** took the steps necessary to make that child's story heard.

In 2011, the National Children's Alliance launched the "One With Courage" campaign centered around the courage it takes to talk about child sexual abuse—the courage it takes child victims to come forward and talk about their abuse and the courage it takes adults to talk about the issue, learn the signs and report abuse when it's suspected.

Child sexual abuse is a crime of secrecy which, tragically, permeates within our society because it is difficult to talk about. Talking openly about this issue combats the secrecy that enables it and helps to eradicate child sexual abuse from our communities.

We expect tremendous courage on the part of young victims to make disclosures about their abuse, and as adults we can do no less in responding to them and reporting this to ensure justice and healing.

The **One With Courage** campaign aims to educate the public about the signs of sexual abuse, dispel generally accepted "myths" about this issue and provide communities with specific steps they can take to make a difference in a child's life. Take a few minutes now to familiarize yourself with the training opportunities outlined on page four of this report. Become informed and inspired to take action against child sexual abuse, whether it be starting a dialogue about this issue, equipping yourself with the knowledge needed to recognize the signs of abuse or volunteering here at Project Harmony.

Your involvement and your courage make a very real difference in the life of every one of the children we serve.

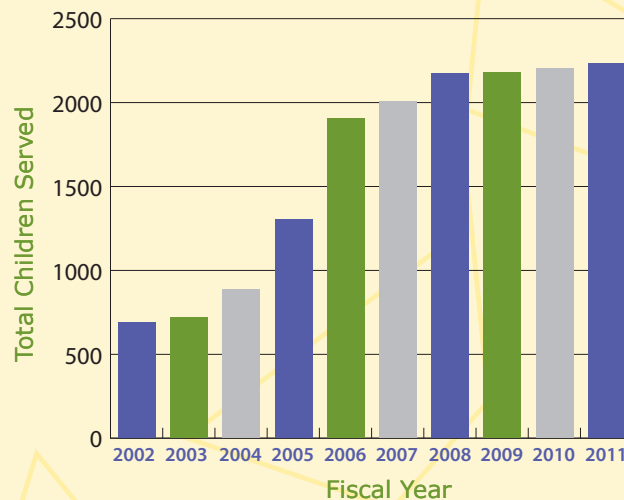

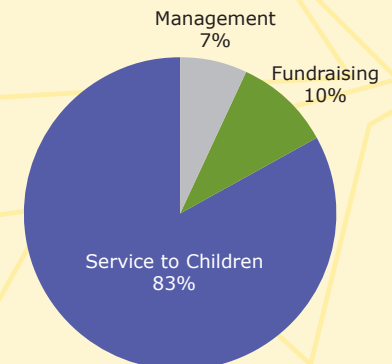

Every year we do more. Yet, there's so much more we can do when we are the **one with courage**

In 2011, Project Harmony entered its 15th year of advocacy for abused and neglected children. An achievement for our community to be sure – with more than 2,230 children evaluated, nearly 3,712 advocacy service contracts provided to victims and a total of 5,468 professionals trained throughout the Omaha-Council Bluffs metro area, 16 Iowa counties and the State of Nebraska.



This year, the number we are focused on is ONE – when each one of us becomes the One With Courage, we are able to address child abuse and neglect in a way no one else can – by giving abused children a voice. We know that no child can be served if their voice is not heard, if their story is not told.

As the One with Courage Child Advocacy Center in this region, Project Harmony joins a national initiative of the National Children's Alliance that is centered on the courage it takes to talk about child sexual abuse and the unique role children's advocacy centers play. One with Courage goes beyond our four walls – giving everyone the ability to be the one to know when a child is being abused or neglected, the one who knows what to do about it and the one to do something about it – to allow that child to tell their truths, and make sure they only need to do it once.

Become the One

How do you know? What can you do? It's all much clearer when you become the One with Courage to:

- ★ Listen and respond – When nine-year-old Jackie told her teacher that her mother's boyfriend had been sexually assaulting her, she and her three-year-old brother, James, were removed from their home and interviewed at Project Harmony. A medical examination found that Jackie not only was sexually abused, but had also contracted a sexually transmitted disease. James was found to have serious health issues including being malnourished and underweight. Both children were treated for head lice, were showered and provided clean clothes. Neither child had been to a physician or medical provider for two years.

The children's protective placement and follow up care were coordinated through collaborative partners, while Project Harmony's Family Advocates continued to monitor the children's well-being.

- ★ Honor your instincts – Will's school nurse called Project Harmony, suspicious of the bruises she observed on his arms and legs. Although the child consistently claimed that he had fallen or scuffled with a friend, she could not square these explanations with his demeanor. When he came to Project Harmony, the seven-year-old told his story of repeated abuse by his parents, was heard and placed in protective custody.
- ★ Keep the child at the center of your concern – Neighbors were concerned for the very small, unkempt children that were always hungry and seldom dressed warmly in the cool autumn air. A spokesman called the DHHS child abuse hotline located at Project Harmony to report their concerns and an investigation was initiated. No evidence of intentional maltreatment was found but community services and parenting support were provided to the family. Any further report will initiate an agency response to provide protective support for these children.
- ★ Never underestimate the power of one person – Courage comes in all sizes. Jessica, age 10, saw her stepfather sexually abusing her 18-month-old sister at bath time and told her mother. Jessica's mother reported it to local law enforcement. Jessica, her mother and sister came to Project Harmony together. Though Jessica had never been able to divulge her own persistent sexual abuse by her stepfather before this time, she simply had to prevent the same abuse of her baby sister.

You have the power to be the One with Courage. And in Nebraska, we are all mandated to act on “any reasonable cause to believe that a child or an incompetent person has been subject to . . . abuse/neglect” and to report to law enforcement or the Child Abuse/Neglect Hotline on behalf of that person.

From vision to voice

In 1992, the Nebraska Legislative Bill 1184, directed each county to develop a single investigatory and assessment protocol for state, county and local officials to use in responding to child abuse and neglect. The Omaha community went a step further – creating an integrated response system AND developing a single child friendly location where all professionals would come together to serve each child, where the child would tell his or her story only once. They envisioned a system with joint accountability where no child would fall through the cracks. Project Harmony opened its doors in 1996.

From one, many

While we encourage the One with Courage, we recognize the many who partner with us. Today, Project Harmony staff work shoulder to shoulder with investigators of the Omaha Police

Department’s Child Victim Unit, Child & Family Service Specialists of the State of Nebraska and Child Saving Institute staff in the Triage Center. In 2012, Project Harmony partnerships will expand to include treatment through Lutheran Family Service, as well as training and research in collaboration with the University of Nebraska at Omaha.

One child.
One place.
One time.

This philosophy is at the core of all we do at Project Harmony. Our services lead to healing for victims, including:

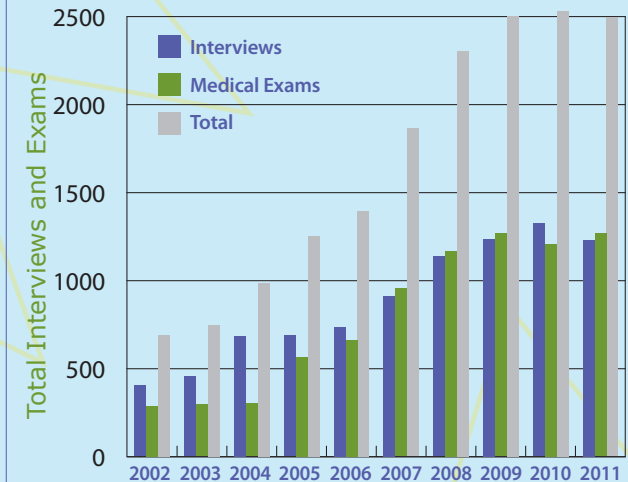
Forensic Interviews – When requested by law enforcement or Child & Family Service Specialists, a forensic interviewer conducts a recorded forensic interview with the child. This reduces the number of times the child must tell their story – and the need to relive the experience again and again.

Medical Examinations – Our medical and nursing staff provides physical and sexual abuse assessments and comprehensive physical exams for alleged victims.

Referrals and Advocacy – Once a child’s needs are assessed, he/she and the non-offending family are referred to the appropriate therapy, support groups and other resources. Over 3,700 advocacy service contacts were provided to victims in 2011.

Case Staffings – A multidisciplinary team of representatives from law enforcement, Child & Family Service Specialists, the medical, legal and educational communities, Project Harmony staff, mental health and others regularly review cases to make sure children do not fall through the cracks.
